# From Jan's Desk

Many thanks to all of the schools, churches, corporations and individuals who donated the harvest from their gardens. Our families were treated to an abundance of fresh produce that they are always delighted to receive.

The summer months were extremely busy for us as we held our Christmas in July Distribution (supplied 283 households with personal care items and cleaning products), Sneaker Distribution (supplied 304 registered school age-children, 61 veterans and 87 seniors with brand new sneakers and socks), our Summer Lunch Program (supplied 359 children with additional food) and our Back to School Distribution (supplied 307 registered school-age child with a new backpack filled with school supplies). We are currently working on Thanksgiving and Christmas.

I'm sure by now everyone has seen the articles relating to what is being described as a "tsunami" of product to be released by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. To clarify, while we will probably receive some additional food, I guarantee you it will not be a tractor trailer full (as one article insinuated). Our concern is that our donors will read these articles and think we are overloaded with food. Just to give you an example, in our last fiscal year the donated food we received through the federal and state combined was less than 1% of the food we distributed! We depend solely on individual, corporate and organizational donations to keep the Pantry in operation. It is only through the generosity of our donors that we are able to provide our families with the quantity and quality of food they receive.

On one of those scorching days this summer as I was walking through our registration room, I passed this adorable little 7 year old girl. She looked up at me and said, "I don't know why they turned our electric off." She commented on how nice it was to be at the Pantry in the air conditioned room. Before the family left, through our Benefits Enrollment Assistance Program (BEAP), we were able to enroll the family in a payment program with PECO and partnered with another agency to pay their overdue bill. As I know I have mentioned before, the most rewarding part of working at the Pantry is not only knowing that in a small way you are making a difference in the lives of the people we serve, it is also a daily reminder of how blessed you are and how much we take for granted.

Everyone at the Pantry wishes you and your families a most joyous holiday season.

### **Pantry to Help Clients Obtain** Medicare Savings, Heating Grants, Property Tax Relief

A busy year continues for the Lord's Pantry Benefits Enrollment Assistance Program (BEAP). In September, Pantry clients 65 years or older were mailed information on how to apply for Medicare savings programs that would pay their Part B premiums, deductibles, and co-pays. Qualifying clients could save over \$1600 each year. Beginning November 1, BEAP counselors will assist clients in applying for winter heating assistance through Pennsylvania's Low-Income Heating Assistance Program (LIHEAP). Qualifying clients will receive assistance with a heating bill and will be eligible for crisis grants up to \$500 to have a heater repaired or a shut-off notice averted. Over the winter, BEAP will strive to make sure that all clients who own their homes are receiving the PA Homestead Exclusion for their school taxes. The homestead exclusion is a tax-relief measure that reduces school property taxes by lowering the assessed value of a property and, therefore, the amount of tax owed. Residents in the Downingtown School District typically save over \$200 a year if approved for the exclusion. BEAP will facilitate the paperwork (one-page form) for each interested client. Further, clients who own their mobile home on a rented lot (i.e. in a mobile home park) will be offered assistance in appealing their property tax assessments. Mobile homes depreciate rapidly but tax assessments are not lowered unless the owner appeals. An appropriate adjustment to an assessment set 15 years ago can lower an owner's tax liability by 70-90%. Counselors will help complete the paperwork and attend the appeal hearings with the clients. These efforts complement BEAP's daily mission to help our clients become more independent, self-sufficient, and secure. Thank you for your support of the Lord's Pantry that allows BEAP to provide these vital services to our clients.

### **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**

The Pantry's Benefit Enrollment Assistance Program (BEAP) was started by five Pantry volunteers as an expression of their intent to more effectively care for our clients. Our team of counselors provides one-on-one assistance with benefit applications, submits support documents to the state, and provides education, information and referrals to a network of local agencies. None had any formal training but felt empowered by compassion and love to make a difference and jumped into the fray. We currently have an opportunity for an interested member of our community to join the BEAP team as a counselor. We are particularly in need of someone who speaks Spanish. No experience is necessary – you will get on-the job training by a current counselor and be allowed to work at your own pace. Most counselors work one 2-hour shift a week.
